Board of Trustee Meeting January 2020

The Board of Trustees meet for their quarterly meeting on January 29, 2020. The board took action to send the Fidelity Award timeline back to committee. Additional information will be shared as recommended by the committee. The board elected Ed Nelson as the new treasurer and to voted to hire a tax preparer in Kentucky. The board approved the quarterly financials and the Executive Director's report. The Board approved a Dual Credit initiative with EduServe which would provide a partnership opportunity for high school and college dual credit as well as opportunities for teacher exchanges and summer camp opportunities. The dates, location, and theme for the 2020 conference was approved.

The Board also took action to form a marketing committee that would help with the graphic design of an Invitational Education membership brochure and information card. (See more below.)
